Team Singapore gears up for the 31st SEA Games in Hanoi

Team Singapore will be fielding 425 athletes in 33 sports at the upcoming 31st Southeast Asia Games (SEA Games) in Hanoi, Vietnam in May.

526 events in 40 sports will feature in Vietnam as the country prepares to host the Games for the second time after its debut in 2003. Of the 425 Team Singapore athletes, 245 athletes will be making their debut at the regional event which was postponed from December 2021 as a result of the pandemic. The athletes include diver Max Lee, 14, as the youngest member of the team and billiards world champion Peter Gilchrist at 54 years old as the most senior athlete reflecting the diversity of the contingent.

The first event for Team Singapore begun in Hanoi, when the beach handball competition kicked off the Games on 6 May. The Games will officially commence on 12 May, when the opening ceremony takes place and is scheduled to end on 23 May.

3-time Silat world champion Sheik Farhan was unveiled as the contingent's flag bearer. The 2017 SEA Games champion

said, "Representing Singapore has always been very special to me, to be able to lead the contingent as flag bearer this time will make this SEA Games a particularly memorable one for me. I can't wait to compete at a major Games again, and look forward to enjoy the experience in Hanoi."

Chef de mission S. Sinnathurai said. "This edition of the SEA Games is an unprecedented one. After a year of postponement, our athletes are very eager to compete to put to test the training and hard work they have put in over the past few years. The Games will be spread across 12 provinces and athletes and officials will be housed in different hotels. My assistant chefs de mission - Ms Asmah Hanim and Mr Damien Ler - and I will be on the ground to support the team. Resources are dedicated to this decentralised plan with the health and safety of the contingent as the top priority. I hope Singaporeans can lend their support to cheer for Team Singapore as they do their best to represent the nation in Hanoi."



Congratulations to TeamSG shuttler and reigning World Champion Loh Kean Yew on being crowned The Straits Times' Athlete of the Year 2021!

Kean Yew could barely walk after a grueling quarters and semi-finals at the World Championships, but pushed through the pain of a rolled ankle to become Singapore's first badminton world champion.

Also a deserving shout-out to the six TeamSG athlete-nominees for their passion, commitment and dedication to fly our Singapore flag high in 2021:

- Aloysius Yapp, World number one in Pool

Athlete-In-Focus

Suhairi Suhani, TeamSG Long Jumper, is a

Paralympian and 2-time Asean Para Games Silver medalist. When his *spex*Scholarship ended in 2021, Suhairi felt uncertain on his next steps and contacted the *spex*Business team to assist him in his job search to supplement his income while continuing with his sporting aspirations.



One cannot tell at all that Suhairi has intellectual impairment. He was diagnosed with the disability after a bout of high fever when he was young. Suhairi's positive demeanor, good attitude combined with a little luck quickly secured him a part-time retail role with spexBusiness partner, Adidas Singapore, in just 3 weeks. Suhairi was all smiles when asked about his stint thus far in the company. "I am very happy to find a part-time job that can allow me to train and compete. Furthermore, the role is related to sport and I can apply my learnings as an athlete to this job" he assured.

Suhairi articulated clearly how much he enjoyed his work as he learnt the retail floor operations and even visual merchandising from his full-time peers at work. It is no wonder that he is one of the top consistent sales performers at his store. Already into his 5th month working at Adidas, Suhairi espouses Adidas's mantra of "Through sports, we have the power to change lives". He is clear of his goal — To win as many medals as possible to demonstrate that people with intellectual disability can pursue better lives and have greater opportunities for themselves too. Suhairi is relentless in his pursuit to achieve this and trains everyday in between work, almost like a full-time athlete, however tiring that may be.





Lee Chee Yong, TeamSG Floorballer, joined the Men's national team in 2019 and in that same year, they won first place in the Asia Oceanic Floorball Cup and clinched the silver medal at SEA Games.

Chee Yong started his management trainee role with Adidas during the Covid-19 situation where almost every company adopted some form of working from home, making social interactions amongst colleagues almost non-existent. But Chee Yong fit in immediately that it is impossible to tell that he is less than a year into this role. Referred to Adidas Singapore through the *spexBusiness* team, Chee Yong secured the role in Adidas through his own merit, bringing to the table intrinsic traits that come with his sporting background such as resilience, leadership and competitiveness.

"I am enjoying my time in Adidas so far. People in Adidas are friendly and always willing to help out when needed. There are many programmes that you can pick up in your free time to learn more about functions and skillsets that you are interested in. I am also in the mentorship programme where I am attached to a senior executive, and he will help provide feedback and guidance on my career."

In November 2021, he was part of the Floorball National team selected to go for a 2-week overseas training camp before the World Cup Competition held in Finland. Chee Yong informed his line manager who was fully supportive of him going. "We started planning early and were able to work out a flexible working schedule for me to complete my work remotely," Chee Yong asserted. Thankful to receive such unwavering support from Adidas, Chee Yong can continue with his training and gain work experience in a multinational company simultaneously without much worries.

"We want to support our local athletes meaningful through learning and career development, and at the same time, enable them to pursue their dreams and fly the Singapore flag high proud." said spexBusiness partner, Adidas.
